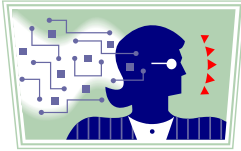
purse or in your pocket – Just think " These little bits of change might just change someone's life. Then reach over a little instead of down and drop that change in the baby bottle.
