It was written by Frank Weaver and was published in the Suburbanite in December of 2010. Debbie Rubino copied it and sent it off to Tom and Polly who live half of the year here in Akron and half of the year in Southern California. Thank you for sharing, it brought a lot of smiles!

Ned's Christmas Eggnog...This recipe was provided by the late Patty Mohrman Herwick who ran Patty's Book Store on 619 for many years. Patty was Ruth & Ned Mohrman's only child. Ned, of course is the Portage Lakes icon whose name has been immortalized on the Iron Channel Bridge. For years Ned was involved in the annual Portage Lakes Santa Home delivery program. The same one the organization has sponsored since time began. Halfway through the run Ned stopped at his home on Portage Point Boulevard and treated the volunteers to some Christmas cheer...his special eggnog. His wife Ruth actually made it, Ned only served it. The volunteers always left with a warm, cozy feeling full of Christmas

spirit. For years I'd ask Ned for that recipe, and he'd always promise, someday Frank, someday. Then one Christmas just before he passed on Ned staved true to his promise. I made extra copies and had the master copy in the Pennsylvania Dutch cook book my mother gave me one year for a birthday gift; at least that's where I thought I'd put it. That Christmas there was no recipe to be found. Naturally I was absolutely mortified. About five years later I was telling Patty about my experience with her dad's Christmas eggnog and how I had lost the recipe. "You want the recipe Frank?" No problem she said, and she wrote it down on paper from memory. Here, and enjoy it she said with a Merry Christmas. Well folks I'm sure you can understand how I was instantly in my glory. I slipped the recipe into my wallet in my coat's inner breast pocket, pulled the zipper closed, and took off for home, eyeing anything and everything suspiciously and suspecting all kinds of shenanigans from every person I encountered. The reason I prefer this recipe is because eggs are not used. Yep, you read that right folks, it is eggless eggnog, but because it is so delicious you would never know that. So, folks, as my Christmas gift to you from the creativeness of a Portage Lakes icon, Ned Mohrman, I will share with you, "The Recipe".

Ingredients: Important DO NOT use eggs, instead buy a 1/2 gallon of very, very, very cheap vanilla ice cream. To that add two teaspoons of vanilla extract and two cups of 2% white milk. Set aside a dash or two of nutmeg. Except for the nutmeg, mix all the ingredients well with a hand or electric mixer. Pour into holiday glasses, sprinkle with nutmeg and enjoy. Now the reason for the very, very, very cheap vanilla ice cream is because it has gelatin, and as it melts, it quickly thins. Take one sip and you'll never know it was made without eggs. According to Ned, many folks refused to drink eggnog because they either didn't like it or they preferred not consuming raw eggs. That is, until they tried "The Recipe", then they were hooked. Now if you wish to strengthen it by 'doctoring' this holiday beverage with the spirits that some consume strictly for medicinal values, I prefer not including that part where you substitute a cup of whatever for a cup of the white milk. After all, this is a family newspaper. Finally cut this out, place it where it will be safe until next year and the next and the next. Don't forget where you hid it, and then enjoy the holidays year after year. When you pass this on to others make sure you tell them it's Ned Mohrman's recipe, not mine and definitely not yours.
