Recipients and their families were present, along with Manchester Superintendent Shaun Morgan and Coventry Superintendent George Fisk, as well as the Schookman family. Now, let's meet the recipients!

Corinne Hite from Manchester High School has been very busy the last four years. She was Vice President of the Key Club and has helped deliver roses for several years. She was in the Panther Pack Peer Mentor Program, the National Honors Society, the Pep Club, was on the Varsity Cheerleading team, as well as the basketball and softball team. Out in the community she volunteers at the Tudor House, Akron Children's Hospital, and with sports camps. In the fall Corinne is headed to the Ohio State University where she will major in Chemistry on a pre-med track.

Natalie Pham from Manchester High School is the Key Club President leading many projects. Natalie was President of the National Honors Society, President of the Summit County 4H Trail Blazers, is on the Summit County Jr. Fairboard, was a Panther Pack Mentor, President of the Science Club, and a member of the Art Club. Natalie is a hard worker, she has coordinated book drives and blanket making for St. Luke's Nursing Home and headed holiday card making for those deployed serving in the military.
