This week our member spotlight will shine on Honorary member Glen Sheets. Glen was born in Akron, Ohio in 1937. He has lived in Coventry and Manchester, and now resides in Canal Fulton. Glen attended grades 1 thru 6 in Springfield Township, grades 7 thru 12 in Coventry, and then attended the University of Akron. He played basketball his Junior and Senior years and was in the Minstrel program. He ran for President but lost by six votes, the closest race ever at Coventry. He was also in the Junior and Senior class play productions. Glen met his wife Georgia at Coventry High School and they dated through their junior and senior years. They got married on August 9, 1959. They have a son Guy who lives near Philadelphia and a daughter Colleen who lives here locally. They have four grandchildren; Kyle, Tori, Rachel, and Ryan and two great grandchildren Leo and Luka. In the 80's he worked at East Ohio Gas, then taught at Coventry High School for 30 plus years. After retiring from

teaching he worked at the Portage Lakes Park on the Lake Patrol team. After that he was a tour escort for several years. A fun fact that most people would not know is that he plays the ukulele. He was also elected as a State Representative in Cole County. Glen's favorite hobby is fishing and watching sports and attending games. His fishing buddies were Paul Lepley and Paul Liikala, both of which passed away far too early. Glen's favorite music is 'older' tunes. He has done a lot of traveling as a tour escort and some of his favorites were New York, the Florida Keys, and Lake Erie. The one item he can't live without is his wife, the apple of his eye. The people that have inspired him the most are his wife Georgia, his friends Paul Lepley and Paul Liikala, and also teacher Mae Packan. Glen joined the Portage Lakes Kiwanis in April of 1995. He can't remember who his sponsor was! Glen has received two Legion of Honor Awards. He was Santa Claus on Christmas Eve for several years, helped at the Pancake Breakfast, and did some music programs in the club. Christmas Eve is what he has enjoyed the most about being in our club. The advise he would give to someone joining Kiwanis is to attend the meetings and to support fundraising activities. He is thankful for the Kiwanians that volunteer time after time and do so much to keep the club together through the years.
